Waterfront dining is fairly easy to come by in our lay of the land, but it's no wonder 5 o'Clock Somewhere Bar at Margaritaville rises to the top of the list. Think bar bites, tropical drinks, live entertainment and a daily sunset ritual. The Intracoastal-facing restaurant features a Water Taxi stop that takes guests to and from Fort Lauderdale's Las Olas Boulevard, and it serves as a launching pad for paddleboarding and kayak excursions. After a day of exploring, guests can enjoy happy hour from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday with two-for-one draft beers, well drinks, wine and the Who's to Blame Margaritas.
